Chers participants,

Nous entrons dans une décennie qui sera marquée par les transitions vertes et digitales. Cela aura des implications socio-économiques profondes et l'Europe devra s'appuyer sur ses écosystèmes de recherche et d'innovation pour être capable de répondre aux défis qui se présentent.

Il faut aussi compter sur le Conseil Européen de l'Innovation qui sera la «fabrique Européenne à licornes» pour porter les technologies disruptives sur les marchés.

Dans cette optique, l'Espace Européen de la Recherche renforcée est la base nécessaire pour soutenir les chercheurs et les innovateurs. Cela inclut notamment des actions précises sur l'interconnexion des réseaux de chercheurs, une politique concertée en termes d'éducation et de formation et une collaboration renforcée entre les milieux académiques et industriels.

En effet, il est capital d'inclure tout le domaine éducatif dans ces transitions ; c'est pourquoi il est tellement important de promouvoir les synergies entre l'Espace Européen de la Recherche et celui de l'Éducation, mais aussi entre Horizon Europe et d'autres programmes comme Erasmus + ou encore les Fonds de Cohésion.

Connecter les écosystèmes industriels et scientifiques est crucial pour renforcer et étendre la coopération entre les acteurs innovants et faire de l'Europe un continent vert, digital et inclusif.

Mariya Gabriel
Commissioner for Innovation, Research, Culture, Education, and Youth

Mariya Gabriel is the European Commissioner for Innovation, Research, Culture, Education, Youth and Sport. Under her leadership, the new Horizon Europe, Erasmus+, and the cultural strand of Creative Europe programmes (2021-2027) will be defined and implemented.

Her main priorities are excellence in research, innovation and education (ERA, EEA, EIA); tackling the R&I divide in Europe; Europe as a leader in strategic innovation areas through the digital and green transition, with a particular attention for young people and regions. "No one left behind" and "Think out of the box" are her mottos.

Between 2017 and 2019, Mariya Gabriel was European Commissioner for Digital Economy and Society. She proposed the new Digital Europe programme, worked on EU Strategy on AI, disinformation online, cybersecurity and launched the EuroHPC strategy. She has extensively engaged with external EU partners to enhance digital cooperation, in particular with the Western Balkans and Africa. She was elected as Member of the European Parliament (MEP) in 2009, 2014 and 2019. Mariya Gabriel is First Vice-President of the European People's Party (EPP), and, since 2012, Vice-President of EPP Women.

Commissioner Gabriel is a board member of the United Nations youth programme Generation Unlimited (GenU). She has been ranked among the 50 most influential women in Europe in the field of cybersecurity by the leading European cybersecurity magazine SC Media UK (2019). Mariya Gabriel is also known for her involvement in the fight for gender equality. Among others, she received the prestigious Italian prize "Golden Apple" for highest achievements for women. At the European Parliament, she was awarded twice "MEP of the year" - in 2016 for the Development category, and in 2013 for the Gender Equality category.

In November 2020, Commissioner Gabriel received the Annual Award of the Vienna Economic Forum "Partner of the Year 2020" for contribution to the economic development, rewarding Ms Gabriel's vision of a European knowledge strategy comprising the European Education Area, the European Research Area and the new Digital Education Action Plan.

She holds a Master's degree in political sciences and international relations from the Institute of Political Studies (Bordeaux, FR) and a Bachelor's degree in Bulgarian and French Languages from "Paisii Hilendarski" University (Plovdiv, BG). She also graduated from "Dr.Petar Beron" Language High School (Kyustendil, BG).



FIORENCE Parly
Minister of the Armed Forces

From 1991 to 1993, she was a junior advisor in the Ministry of Public Service, then in the Ministry of Housing and Equipment, and finally in the Ministry of the Interior. In 1993, she returned to the administrative sector where she was appointed as Head, Protection and Social Security Office in the Budget Directorate, then for housing, equipment, city and urban planning (1994-1995), and finally for culture and audiovisual matters (1995-1997).

In 1997, she served as Advisor for budget affairs in Prime Minister Lionel Jospin's Office. She was then appointed Secretary of State for Budget in 2000, a post she vacated in 2002. After her Government career, Florence Parly took on the responsibilities of Mission Head in the

France Trésor Agency (2003 - 2004), before becoming Chairwoman of the board, Regional Development Agency of Ile-de-France, until 2006.

She then chose to work with national companies and joined France's largest industrial and transport corporations. In 2006 she joined Air France and took up the position of Director for Investment Strategy (2006-2008), then Deputy Director General in charge of Cargo (2008-2012), before becoming Deputy Director General in charge of short-haul activities (Orly and Escales France) in 2013. Florence Parly joined SNCF in 2014, first as Assistant Director General, then as Director General, «SNCF Voyageurs», in 2016.

On the 21st June 2017, Florence Parly was appointed Minister for the Armed Forces.



Andres Sutt
Minister of Entrepreneurship and Information Technology

Mr Andres Sutt is the Estonian Minister of Entrepreneurship and Information Technology since 26 January 2021. He was elected to Riigikogu on March 3, 2019 as a member of the liberal Reform Party. Mr Sutt has over 25 years of international experience in central banking, bank restructuring and crisis management. He has worked as the Deputy Governor of the Bank of Estonia, as the head of banking at the European Stability Mechanism and as a senior advisor to the head of the European Financial Stability Facility. In addition, he has been the Estonian representative at the Executive Board of the IMF. He has also worked as the Chief Services Officer for Enefit, the largest energy utility enterprise in Estonia.

Mr Sutt serves as the board member of SOS Children Village Estonia, Estonian Maternity Hospitals Foundation and University of Tartu Foundation.

He has a master's degree in economics and finance (cum laude) from Tartu University, Estonia and has studied management in INSEAD, France.







Jean-Yves Le Drian
Minister for Europe and Foreign Affairs

Jean-Yves Le Drian has been France's Minister for Europe and Foreign Affairs since May 2017. He was formerly Minister of Defence (2012-2017), and Minister of State for Marine Affairs, attached to the Minister for Infrastructure, Housing, Transport and Space (1991-1992).

Jean-Yves Le Drian has hold several electoral mandates at the national level and in the Brittany region: he was President of the Regional Council of Brittany (2004-2012), a Regional Councillor (1998-2004), a Member of Parliament for the Morbihan Department (1978-1991 and 1997-2007), Mayor of Lorient (1981-1998), and Municipal Councillor in Lorient (1977-2004). He is also Representative for the Regions at the Board of the European Committee of the Regions, since 2005.

He completed his studies at the University of Rennes 2, and holds an Agrégation in History.



Margiris Abukevičius
Vice-Minister for International Cooperation and Cyber security

Margiris Abukevičius is Vice Minister of National Defence of the Republic of Lithuania. He is responsible for international cooperation and cybersecurity.

Previously, M. Abukevičius was the Senior Advisor at the Cyber Security and Information Technology Policy Group of the Ministry of National Defence responsible for projects of international cooperation in the area of cybersecurity and initiatives of bilateral cooperation with the U.S.

When working as Defence Advisor and Cyber Attaché at the Permanent Representation of Lithuania to the EU in 2015 – 2019, M. Abukevičius contributed to the shaping of the Lithuanian stance on the EU security and defence and cybersecurity issues, and was one of the negotiators concerning the Permanent Structured Cooperation (PESCO) and European Defence Fund establishment and development of EU legislation for the area of cyber security. He is also one of the initiators and developers of the Lithuanian-led PESCO Cyber Rapid Response Teams project.

M. Abukevičius started working at the Ministry of National Defence in 2004. In 2004 – 2014 he held responsibilities concerning EU Common Security and Defence Policy and EU affairs coordination, and was a member of the Lithuanian Presidency of the Council of the EU team.

M. Abukevičius holds a BA and a MA received at the Institute of International Relations and Political Science of Vilnius University, and also studied in Berlin and Geneva.



Axelle Lemaire
Global Head of Terra Numerata - Roland Berger | Former State Secretary in charge of Digital Affairs and Innovation

A French and Canadian citizen, Axelle Lemaire works as a Parner at Roland Berger, a leading European based strategy consulting firm. She is the Global Head of Terra Numerata, the company's digital ecosystem composed of +110 startups specialized in the fields of innovation and sustainability. Between 2014 and 2017 Axelle was a member of the French Government in charge of Digital Affairs and Innovation. She called her portfolio "the ministry for imagination". Axelle helped launch the French Tech program for startups, including the Green Tech label for startups during the COP21 Conference, introduced the Digital Republic Bill to Parliament, initiated the first national artificial intelligence strategy in Europe and the national Roadmap on cyberprotection, negotiated net neutrality at the European level and supported multiple projects in relation with accessibility and inclusion. She was awarded the "Innovation in Politics" European Prize for the way in which her legislative work was discussed with citizens, using an online platform and a fully transparent and collaborative process.

With her political, regulatory and business background, Axelle believes that technologies can empower people to make the world a better place. She chairs the strategic committee of Hopening, a company advising NGOs and charities in their fundraising activities, and sits on the steering committee of PositivePlanet, an NGO empowering entrepreneurs in impoverished areas.
